Medical Interview	Marks
Clarifies the nature of the presenting problem Asks what the patient means by "trouble swallowing" (1), clarifies whether the problem relates to solids or liquids (0 OR 2), asks about the level of obstruction (0 OR 2), asks whether food has ever been completely stuck (0 OR 2)	Out of 7 (2)
Asks about time course and associated features Asks if difficulty swallowing is present every time (0 OR 2), asks about progression of the symptom (0 OR 2), asks about the timing of the obstruction with respect to swallowing (1), asks if there has been nasal regurgitation (1) or associated choking or coughing (1)	Out of 7 (2)
Asks about history of risk factors for oesophageal disease Asks about history of reflux disease (1) and treatment for this condition, including adherence (2), asks whether the patient has ever had an endoscopy (1), asks about smoking (1) and alcohol consumption (1)	Out of 6 (3)
Asks about symptoms suggestive of malignancy Asks about weight loss (1), vomiting (1), haematemesis (1), haemoptysis (1) and dyspnoea (1)	Out of 5 (3)
